### **DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST:** (state briefly why legislative action is requested)

April 8, 2024

The Albany County Department of Health (ACDOH) has been notified of continued funding to support its Expanded Partner Services Program (ExPS). The ExPS program uses data to identify individuals diagnosed with HIV who have no recent HIV follow-up lab work in the past 13 to 24 months. The expected outcomes are to reduce disease incidence, decrease the rate of HIV transmission, increase the proportion of HIV infected individuals who are aware of their status, and increase the proportion of infected persons who are linked to prevention, partner services and treatment/medical care. The County will facilitate the re-engagement in medical care of persons thought to be out-of-care living with HIV/AIDS, notify, test partners and refer all HIV positive and high-risk negative patients it encounters to appropriate prevention, care and support services.

The grant amount is \$348,749 for the period of April 1, 2025 through March 31, 2026. ACDOH requests authorization to accept this grant award and enter into a contract with the NYSDOH Aids Institute / Health Research Incorporated.
