New York State Department of State 2024 Statewide Investment in More Swimming (SWIMS) Discretionary Contract

The New York State Department of State's Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) will make approximately \$5 million available in reimbursable grants to municipalities through counties and certain large cities to incentivize lifeguard recruitment and retention. The NY SWIMS Lifeguard Grant Program is intended to address a critical shortage of staff lifeguards (including lifeguards contracted through third parties, or contracted lifeguards), available at public locations, including pools and beaches in New York State municipalities. As part of the application process, an eligible list of counties and cities has been established (see below). The counties listed will work with their municipalities to, and the cities listed will, identify public swimming locations and outline how funding will increase the number of staff and/or contracted lifeguards, and/or expand operating hours.

SWIMS Lifeguard Grant funding may be used to cover project costs related to safe swimming opportunities at public swimming locations including:

- Advertising for lifeguard positions;
- Lifeguard retention and referral bonuses;
- Supplementing hourly lifeguard wages; and,
- Lifeguard salary increases.

Counties and cities listed in the eligibility chart below may be NY SWIMS grant recipients. However, as part of an application counties should solicit input from constituent local governments (i.e., cities, towns, villages) to identify lifeguard assistance opportunities, including those in distressed communities.¹ DOS will make one award per eligible county or city; agreements with partner local governments (or project partners) will be the responsibility of the eligible counties and cities listed in the eligibility chart.

The Contract term and period of funding will be April 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025.

This will be a reimbursement-based grant contract and no advances will be made.

All requests for funding must be received by close of business, July 26, 2024, to the Division of Local Government Services at SWIMS@dos.ny.gov. Requests received after this date may not be considered and no extensions will be granted. To formally request grant funds of up to the amount on the accompanying eligibility list, please submit the completed SWIMS application by email confirming your county's or city's interest in the Program and the location(s) of public swimming areas your county or city plans to support with grant-funded lifeguards. All applicants must complete the NY SWIMS application, which includes Parts 1, 2 and 3. Note Part 3 is the Budget and Workplan. A list of eligible municipalities (i.e., counties and cities) is included in this notice. Funding cannot be distributed to eligible municipalities without the completion of all above information and the execution of the associated contract. The Department of State reserves the right to utilize unused funds at a future date.

DLGS will host a webinar on Tuesday, June 4, 2024, at 2:00 PM to answer questions related to the new NY SWIMS Lifeguard Grant Program. Information regarding the webinar will be forthcoming by email. 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Upon procurement approval, the Division of Local Government Services will issue a contract package. Upon receipt of the contract package, please return completed forms within **two weeks** of receipt to SWIMS@dos.ny.gov.

Eligible costs are those costs that are incurred to directly support increasing safe swimming opportunities. This includes advertising, personal services, and fringe benefits. Counties and cities listed on the eligibility list are each permitted to submit two reimbursement vouchers for the contract approved for this procurement; reimbursement for expenses incurred after September 30, 2025 will be ineligible. All reimbursement vouchers and supporting documentation must be submitted to DLGS by December 31, 2025.
