General Project Information

Describe the arts/cultural/tourism activities your organization provides in Albany County.

Bring on the Spectrum Community Space and Sensory Gym hosts social, recreational and lifestyle activities for neurodiverse individuals of all ages, all abilities at our centrally-located facility at 71 Fuller Rd, Albany, 12205. We are immediately off both I-90 and I-87.

We have traditional art classes -- drawing, painting, ceramics, clay, mixed media. We also offer other creative arts including music, Improv and dance. Our hope for the fall is a Disney cabaret show.

In addition to the creative arts, we offer Zumba, yoga, Cooking Classes, fitness classes, Lego club, movie nights and more.

Albany County will benefit in three key ways (1)) prominence amongst neurodiverse families by welcoming them to enjoy all that Albany County has to offer; (2) economic impact from a family's stay in the #518 (hotel, restaurants, gas, incidentals); (3) providing collaboration opportunities amongst local businesses and nonprofits within Albany County to make the county stronger together.

If an award is made, describe how the funds will help you to sustain your operations in Albany County.

We will be in Albany County for the long haul. We love our location and the ease of access from I-90 and I-87. We are in a building that has ample parking with "eyes on the door", helpful to families with individuals who elope. We are on a bus line. But for an non profit, it's a struggle to "do the work" and serve the community while strategizing for the future. This grant allows us to further establish ourselves while expanding our reach and impact through tourism. The opportunity to welcome visitors to BOTS from a broader area helps us, helps other non profit organizations in Albany County and helps the local business community.

Describe the extent to which the COVID-19 pandemic increased or decreased demand for your services. As an option, you may attach to this application any optional information that supports you're the service increase or decrease being described below.

This program is particularly relevant today. Neurodiverse individuals and families were uniquely impacted by COVID-19. Neurodiverse adults in residential homes had to remain there with no visitors. Youth and children had no sports or lifestyle activities. They struggled with remote school, both from March 2020-June 2020 as well as interruptions to consistent in-person schooling from September 2020 to June 2021. During those 18 months, school districts struggled to fulfill IEPs. Children/tweens/teens did not receive their full support services. During the 2021-2022 school year, things improved but both school life and community life did not return to "normal" nor is the "new normal" ideal for the neurodiverse population. Today, programs for neurodiverse adults (day hab, without walls) are not at pre-pandemic levels. Individuals are not "out in the community" as many times per week as they once were. And, more critical, students who "aged out" of school during the COVID years are on wait lists to get into a program. They are at home with nothing to do. The direct support professional crisis has also had a huge impact on the ability for neurodiverse individuals of all ages to access the community. Bring on the Spectrum Community Space and Sensory Gym was needed pre-COVID; it is vital now.

"BOTSA-Family Getaway to Albany County" would be the project title to the public. For us and Albany County, it is "Bring on the Families".

Bring on the Spectrum Community Space & Sensory Gym is the only one of its kind within a minimum three hour radius of Albany County. Our Project, "BOTSA-Family Getaway to Albany County" will offer a major piece of what's missing from a family's life when there is a member with autism; the ability to travel and visit attractions that are not only of interest but mindful of the necessary safety, acceptance and understanding. We will reach out to neurodiverse families within a 200 mile radius of Albany County and invite them for BOTSA-Family Getaway to Albany County. Our focus will be on guest visits during Autism Acceptance Month in April 2024, April 2025 and April 2026. We will launch with a press conference in the fall with County Executive McCoy and key partners and promote/advertise during the winter. We will partner with area arts and cultural organizations to make their visit to Albany County memorable. Our goal with this program is to serve a minimum of 100 families over the course of the project.

Please describe the entity's capabilities to implement the project you propose including organizational structure, staff members involved, a summary of similar initiatives you have undertaken and the date they were completed:

Bring on the Spectrum is more than capable of managing this project. We will assign weekly hours to one staff person to work on this project under the guidance of our CEO, Lisa Audi. Lisa is well versed in tourism and event travel from her time at Pepsi Arena where she was part of a team that secured the NCAA Frozen Four, NCAA Sweet Sixteen and NCAA Wrestling Championships and an impressive 8 NCAA events in 10 years. Later, in 2006-2008 while at Ed Lewi Associates, Lisa worked closely with the then-named ACCVB as well as CDTA on "Fan Fests" that were coordinated on behalf of the Capital Region LOC. A member of the business community for more than 30 years, Lisa is a strong believer in collaboration amongst nonprofits and local businesses, the crux of the Bring on the Families initiative. Recently BOTS completed a project with NYS Department of Health which included implementing 10 field trips with rural school districts in the outlying counties of Albany County in a condensed window of 5 months. These field trips included development of the program, distribution of NYS DOH materials and multiple other elements.

Please describe, in detail, the impact your proposed project will have on Arts, Culture and/or Tourism in Albany County. Describe how your project will attract new visitors to Albany County. Where possible use metrics/estimates of impact (i.e. increased visitation etc.).

Quite simply, it's very rare for families with youth especially, with autism or another intellectual or developmental disability, to travel. Our individuals, when dis-regulated, take time to go from the "Red" zone back to the "green" zone. Families worry about being disruptive for other hotel and attraction guests. Our individuals thrive on consistency and a vacation brings slight changes to simple things like when a meal is eaten. BOTS will mitigate these worries by partnering with hotels and local businesses who understand and plan accordingly with dollars budgeted for training. The number of new visitors will most likely be ALL that are secured through this program. In addition, families that have members with autism are loyal; there is a high likelihood of return visits because of its uniqueness. For other arts and culture organizations, it will also be new visitors and more importantly, for those that are nonprofits, it's an opportunity to live the credo we all share in some way -- all means all. And how wonderful will it be for neurodiverse individuals, many who enjoy the creative arts, music, etc., to do so in Albany County?

How will you track performance goals and define success? Include at least two key performance indicators and expected annual outcomes/impact during the reporting period (September 2023 - December 2026).

With specific visit windows (Autism Acceptance, April), with activities hosted at Bring on the Spectrum and with the close collaboration with local hotels and Discover Albany, we will be able to track results. Our year one goal (2024) is 20 families (with multiple guests) with increases year over year. Also of note, there will also be an impact from day visitors not reflected in the aforementioned counts.

And families will know of this program through Facebook pages, blogs, etc that are centered on life with autism.

The initiative doesn't end, it becomes a self-sustaining opportunity. Over the three year window, the process/template will be created, modified and improved so it can continue beyond this initiative. Because no one else is offering this, it will also gain sustainability from press/media attention.

Explain why ARPA Funds Are Needed to Complete the proposed program/project. Would the proposal be Possible Without ARPA Assistance? Describe how your proposal would be impacted if you are awarded a smaller grant than requested?

ARPA funds are needed because the scale of this project requires funding sources that provide for collaboration and innovation relative to tourism.
