With expected expansion of Albany LEAD to two or more new jurisdictions, funding will be needed for additional case management capacity. The planned funding would support 1.5 case managers and a .5 case management supervisor starting in the first year of the grant period, with additional staffing to be added during the second year.

Case managers play the central operational role in Albany LEAD, working with clients to identify needs and help them access benefits, housing, treatment and other services.

Proposed federal funding for case managers and case management supervisor covers 70% of costs, with the remainder expected to be supported by funding from

New York State. "Percent of time" for half-time case manager and half-time case management supervisor reflects 70% of half-time cost (35% of total cost). Case management staffing reflects average caseload of 25 clients per case manager. As part of an initiative to enhance data analysis across Albany LEAD, funding will also be provided to the case management agency to support part of the increasing costs of its data collection and reporting. Work required for performance measurement will be included in this position.

Expansion to additional jurisdictions will also require additional project management capacity. Project managers provide overall leadership with regard to administration, coordination of stakeholders, oversight of case management, and relations with the community and elected officials. This position is expected to be half-time, reflecting population in expansion jurisdictions.

Albany County plays a major role in Albany LEAD through multiple offices including the departments of Mental Health, Probation, Social Services, Public Defender and Alternate Defender as well as those of the elected County Executive, District Attorney and Sheriff. The County data analytics staff is expected to provide new internal analytical support for Albany LEAD as part of overall enhancement of data collection/analysis/reporting and performance measurement.
