Justification: (state briefly why legislative action is requested)

Albany County Mental Health made a portion of the County's Opioid Settlement Funds available to community providers through an RFP process. Agencies and community organizations were permitted to propose initiatives focused on opioid use disorder prevention, treatment or recovery, as well as supportive services such as housing and transportation. The Albany College of Pharmacy's project was selected for funding through an informed review process and will be implemented over the next three years.

Expanding the Collaboratory's harm reduction trainings will help to reduce the number of opioid overdoses and will provide another option for individuals who use drugs to learn about their risks, access Naloxone and receive a referral to treatment. The research project will receive Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval and will survey individuals on the barriers they have encountered when seeking treatment for substance use

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disorder. The Albany College of Pharmacy will produce a report that will be shared with the Department of Mental Health and the substance abuse treatment provider community and could inform efforts to improve engagement in treatment for those at risk of an opioid overdose.
