PROPOSAL SECTION II: Describe the Problem

2.1 The problem this proposal is addressing is as follows: there are a significant number of older adults injuring themselves due to opioid and other substance misuse and entering the Albany Medical Center Emergency Room. This results in high-cost utilization of the Emergency Room/Inpatient services. The rate of recidivism is high and Senior Hope is invested in offering a bridge to outpatient treatment services by placing a peer (CRPA) at the emergency room. The peer will help demystify what outpatient senior services entail and how these services can be beneficial to their health and overall well-being.

2.2 The opioid crisis continues to be of concern among all ages. The tables below illustrate admissions to OASAS-certified chemical dependence treatment programs for ages 50 and older between 2017 and 2021. As evidenced by the data in the tables below, it is clear there is an ongoing need to address the opioid epidemic for those clients struggling with their recovery. This age cohort was less inclined to pursue outpatient services for their opioid and other substance use disorder during the global COVID pandemic. As illustrated the decline of engagement was not indicative of decreased need, but rather fear in pursuing services during COVID. Currently Senior Hope is anticipating an increased need and engagement for clients ages 50 and older for opioid and other substance use disorders. It is for this reason that Senior Hope is pursuing these Opioid Settlement Funds.

2.3 As illustrated in the tables above, a great number of older adults did not attend treatment during the global pandemic due to their co-morbid conditions and fear of contracting COVID. Senior Hope developed a Medication Assistance Treatment (MAT) program during the pandemic, but anticipates an increase in need and engagement in the coming years.

PROPOSAL SECTION III: Describe the Approach

3.1 Senior Hope Counseling's mission is to provide high quality, science-based, compassionate and comprehensive services to mature members of our community, 50 years and older, and their families in a compassionate setting. The clinic serves approximately 140 seniors struggling with substance use disorders annually.

Senior Hope proposes to address the high-rate of injuries experienced at the emergency room due to opioid and substance misuse among older adults. Senior Hope will address the problem as follows:

Senior Hope has an established relationship with Michael Waxman, MD, MPH, FACEP,
Associate Professor and Research Director, Department of Emergency Medicine at Albany Medical
Center. Senior Hope has just initiated placing a peer in the emergency room at Albany Medical Center.
This grant will help expand service delivery at the emergency room and through Senior Hope's outpatient services. Senior Hope received partial funds from a subcontract with Capital Behavioral Health/OASAS
SOR Coast grant to help start this project. This project will be further expanded by these Opioid
Settlement Funds. These funds (one year) will expand the project by providing additional time for clinical

staff, peer support services, intake services and administration to oversee the increase in patients receiving services. This project will be sustained after the grant has ended through insurance reimbursement.

All clients complete a social determinants of health questionnaire that looks at all components of their lives, i.e. food insecurities, housing, and financial instability. Senior Hope is aware that a majority of the clients struggle with co-morbid (mental health and medical) problems, which coupled with social factors requires staff to address their full biopsychosocial needs to provide them with a full spectrum of support. To address these biopsychological needs, Senior Hope participates in the Healthy Alliance "Unite Us" platform, which has over 100 providers that offer a variety of services to clients in need. Senior Hope will utilize this platform to ensure all clients receive a range of services addressing their individual emotional, social and medical needs.

- 3.2 This initiative relates to the priorities established by the New York State Opioid Settlement Task

 Force and by Albany County by helping to reduce the high-cost of emergency room/inpatient services due
 to injuries sustained while using opioid and other substances. By placing a peer (CRPA) at the emergency
 room Senior Hope will help bridge the gap by offering these clients, ages 50 and older, outpatient services
 at Senior Hope Counseling.
- 3.3 The Substance Abuse Mental Health Service Administration (SAMHSA) Treatment Improvement Protocol (TIP) below will be used as the evidence-based service model for this project.

Senior Hope's CEO, Dr. Nicole MacFarland was asked to be a national reviewer of the recent SAMHSA TIP published in September 2020, entitled "TIP 26: Treating Use Disorder in Older Adults". This is the most evidence-based promising practice service model document available worldwide. These evidence-based practices are what Senior Hope has engaged in since its inception in 2002. 3.4 The project will be staffed by the following positions/staff:

Clinical Services - (Cheryl Scheffler, LCSW/CASAC and Louise Bailey, CASAC): Provide individual, group and case management services, which includes meeting one-on-one with clients to address opioid and stimulant misuse and offer ongoing support in this area during group interventions.

Medical Services / Nurse Practitioner (Chinelle Udo Okeke): Provides Medication Assisted
Treatment (MAT) designed to help reduce opioid misuse.

Peer Services - CRPA (Lochiel Phillips): Provides peer-to-peer support designed to share lived experience that help demystify what outpatient treatment entails. Additionally, will offer a bridge to aftercare services from ER to outpatient.

Intake Coordinator/Administrative (Sally Floyd): Provides oversight of incoming referrals and triages new intakes to clinical staff. Maintains client records.

CEO/Clinical Director (Nicole MacFarland, PhD): Provides oversight of the grant and all clinical services. Supervises clinical staff.

Assistant Director of Operations/DEI Manager (Melissa Maisonet): Participates in grant meetings and processing of grant-related vouchers. Also, supervises Intake Coordinator.

3.5 Capital Behavioral Health Network – OASAS 2023-2024 State Opioid Response Grant (SOR III Year 2) provided \$40,348 to initiate the project on September 30, 2023. Funds are being used to provide clinical services hours, peer support, intake services and administration to launch this initiative at Albany Medical Center Hospital's Emergency Room/Inpatient Services.

PROPOSAL SECTION IV: Experience and Expertise

4.1 Senior Hope Counseling is located in downtown Albany at 650 Warren Street. Senior Hope has been providing services to mature members of the Capital Region community who struggle with opioid and substance use disorders for 22 years. Senior Hope's philosophy is to offer a supportive environment to

individuals and their families as they face addiction issues; providing a self-discovery process that encompasses the mind, body and spirit that restores ones self-esteem, self-worth and dignity.

Senior Hope participated in the State Opioid Response (SOR) grant several years ago to address the opioid crisis in rural communities through Albany County Mental Health. Senior Hope's role in this initiative was to provide outpatient, non-intensive, substance use disorder services to elderly clients residing in rural communities. Senior Hope's participation in this initial grant was very helpful in preparing staff to engage in this new SOR initiative (County of Albany RFP# 2024-010). Additionally, Senior Hope recently secured a Capital Behavioral Health Network – OASAS 2023-2024 State Opioid Response Grant (SOR III Year 2), which will provide partial support to move forward with this important initiative.

4.2 Senior Hope Counseling administration and staff have offered support to the 50 and older target population since 2002. In 2014, Senior Hope experienced the highest rate of primary substance of choice being opioid misuse since its inception. The range of clients with primary substance of choice over the years has been between the range of 2% to 14%, with 14% taking place in 2014. During the global pandemic, Senior Hope administration rolled out a newly developed Medication Assistance Treatment (MAT) program to address the growing epidemic. Senior Hope currently has a medical director and nurse practitioner who provide integrated primary care and behavioral health.

Nicole S. MacFarland, PhD, LCSW-R, CASAC - CEO / Clinical Director

Nicole S. MacFarland received her BA from Skidmore College and an MSW from the University of Pennsylvania, School of Social Policy & Practice. In May 2014 she received her PhD from the University at Albany's School of Social Welfare. She is currently Clinical Associate Professor for both the School of Public Health Policy, Management and Behavior and Clinical Associate Professor, School of Social Welfare, State University of New York, University at Albany. Dr. MacFarland has held the position of Executive Director of Senior Hope Counseling, Inc. since 2012 after serving as Clinical Director of Senior Hope for eight years. She is currently President and Chief Executive Officer for Senior Hope. She also holds the position of Executive Director of The Senior Hope Foundation, Inc. a nonprofit, established in 2015 which supports Senior Hope Counseling, Inc. She has lectured locally and nationally on the topic of geriatric addictions and co-occurring disorders among older adults and has been interviewed on TV, for newspapers and the radio over the past several years. Her publications include two book chapters and peer reviewed journal articles. Dr. MacFarland is the recipient of a Hartford Doctoral Fellows Pre-Dissertation Award and the 2009 Individual of Distinction in Addictions Educations and Training Award for NYS. In 2010, she was honored as Social Worker of the Year for New York State at the Annual NASW-NYS conference. Dr. MacFarland's community service includes prior leadership roles within the National Association of Social Workers as Delegate to the National Delegate Assembly representing the Northeast division of NYS and Representative to the Committee on Nominations and Leadership identifications for NASW-Northeast Division.

Melissa A. Maisonet, Assistant Director of Operations and DEI and HR Manager Melissa A. Maisonet has several years of experience in the outpatient and insurance fields, specializing in the overall management of the office and Staff. She has performed in the capacity of Senior Intake Specialist, Senior Provider Service Representative, Finance Coordinator, Office Manager and currently as

the Assistant Director of Operations inclusive of specialties in DEI & Human Resources responsibilities. With her wide knowledge of experience, she has been an asset to numerous organizations inclusive of CDPHP, Hudson Mohawk Recovery Center, Iwaniec Chiropractic, PIA, SPARC and presently Senior Hope Counseling.

Cheryl L. Scheffler LCSW, CASAC, Cheryl L. Scheffler received her CASAC from NYS in 1995 her BA in Psychology from Vassar College, Poughkeepsie NY 1998, and her Social Work Degree from Smith College in 2001. In 1998 Ms. Scheffler was awarded a Watson Fellowship. This Fellowship was dedicated to the study of, Alcohol and Drug Use, Different Forms of Treatment, Difference in Laws and the Impact this has on the societies studied. The research was conducted abroad in multiple countries with the focus on The Netherlands, England, and Switzerland.

Ms. Scheffler began her work with people with Substance Use Disorder and Alcohol Use

Disorder in 1992 as a counselor at Rhinebeck Lodge for Successful Living. She continued to work in the field of Substance Use Disorder with co-occurring mental health diagnosis St. Francis Hospital in

Poughkeepsie NY. Ms. Scheffler continued to work with people who had been diagnosed with Substance

Use Disorder while working at the Montrose NY VA for 13 years. Ms. Scheffler has been employed at

Senior Hope Counseling Inc as a Senior Counselor and MAT Coordinator since October 22, 2020.

Louise Bailey CASAC

Louise received her certification as an Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor in California in 2011.

Louise worked in several inpatient, privately owned and operated treatment facilities in Southern

California. In 2017 Louise relocated to Chatham New York and began working as an Intervention

Counselor at Cairo Durham Middle and High School. She provided counseling for students that were identified as "high risk" due to family situations or use of substances. In 2019 Louise begam working with the Family Services Division of DSS in Greene County and Columbia County. This position involved identifying addicts and alcoholics that came through the CPS system. The position entailed finding appropriate treatment for these people and then tracking their progress while in treatment.

Chinelle Udo Okeke, RN, FNP, Medical Services

Chinelle Udo Okeke has nearly 20 years of experience as a clinical nurse. She has been employed by Senior Hope since February 2023; providing medication assisted treatment to address client needs. Ms. Okeke earned her MSN and BSN degrees at the University of Buffalo.

PROPOSAL SECTION VI: Reporting

6.1 Senior Hope administration the OASAS data system to determine measurable outcomes. On a weekly basis administration inputs data into the OASAS system, which can help capture outcomes, such as engagement and retention of clients in treatment. The following are identifiable goals for the project:

Goal #1 – Improved Recovery: Clients struggling with opioid and stimulant misuse will develop greater insight into the impact opioid and stimulant misuse has on their quality of life.

Senior Hope offers an age-specific out-patient clinic catering exclusively to age 50 and older adults. Clients receive a custom-tailored approach meeting the recovery needs of this unique population. Due to the fact clients feel more comfortable with other in their same age group and talking about age-related issues, treatment outcomes are and will continue to be very high. As a result of treatment, clients may experience renewed relations with adult children and grandchildren.

Goal #2 – Improved Physical and Emotional Well-Being: A significant number of Senior Hope clients struggle with co-morbid mental health and medical conditions in conjunction with substance misuse. These comorbid conditions (medical and mental health) are further exacerbated by the misuse of substances. It is not uncommon for older adults to sustain injuries as a result of being intoxicated or under the influence of other substances. This project will result in improved outcomes for older adults with comorbid medical conditions.

Goal #3 – Decrease High-Rate of Recidivism in Emergency Room / Inpatient Hospital Related to Substance Misuse: By providing peer and clinical education and support, Senior Hope staff will help bridge the services from Albany Medical Center to outpatient treatment.
