Title: Virtual Reality for Non-Opioid Pain Management in the Emergency Department

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Agency / Organization:

Albany Medical College and Albany Medical Center comprise a major academic medical center located in Albany, New York. With a history of over 130 years of service, Albany Medical Center's Emergency Department (ED) handles more than 80,000 visits annually. Within the Department of Emergency Medicine, the Division of Toxicology and Addiction Medicine provides comprehensive inpatient and outpatient care for individuals with opioid use disorder (OUD).

Statement of Proposer qualifications:

Dr. Michael Waxman, the principal proposer on this grant application, is an emergency physician, addiction medicine physician, and preventive medicine physician at Albany Medical Center. Dr. Waxman's office is located at 47 New Scotland Ave. in Albany. Dr. Waxman completed a Preventive Medicine Residency at the University of Albany School of Public Health, which included a 3-month rotation at the Albany County Department of Health practices addiction medicine providing medication for opioid use disorder for those in recovery. Dr. Waxman is the principal investigator for the abovementioned Albany County Grant for the Pain Management Coach and for a federally funded SAMHSA grant for Alternatives to Opioids for Emergency Department Patients with Painful Conditions.

Project Coordinator: Martha Kowalik has 35 years' experience in ED nursing and nursing leadership and is the co-project director on the AMC Alternative Opioids in the ED SAMHSA award. Ms. Kowalik has implemented dozens of initiatives in the AMC ED and has supervised many ED personnel.

Pain Management Coach: Rose Godfrey is a Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor with extensive experience working as an addiction counselor. Since joining the Albany Medical ED in September 2024, she has provided over 1000 patients with alternatives to opioid interventions.

Expertise:

The Albany Medical Health System has made addressing the opioid epidemic a strategic priority, implementing a range of primary, secondary, and tertiary prevention initiatives. In October 2023, the system received a three-year federal grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to expand its "Alternatives to Opioids" program to reduce opioid prescribing in

emergency settings through provider and patient education, alternative pharmacologic treatments, and non-pharmacological therapies (NPT).

Complimenting the SAMHSA grant, we received an Albany County Opioid Settlement Fund Grant to establish the Pain Management Coach program, that delivers Non-Pharmacological Therapies to Emergency Department patients with painful conditions. This Pain Management Coach program has been running successfully for nine months and has provided alternatives to opioids pain management thus far to over 1,000 persons with painful conditions.

Description of the problem:

The opioid epidemic in the United States has persisted for over two decades and continues to profoundly affect communities nationwide. Its origins can be traced to the aggressive marketing of opioids by pharmaceutical companies in the 1990s and 2000s. We now understand that even medically appropriate exposure to opioids carries a risk for developing opioid use disorder (OUD), contributing to the scale of the current crisis.(1) The recent opioid settlement funds stem directly from this chain of events, acknowledging the harm caused by these practices.

Among public health strategies, **primary prevention**—which aims to prevent disease before it occurs—is often the most impactful and cost-effective approach.(2) Lessons from other major health challenges, such as hypertension and HIV, have demonstrated that early interventions yield the greatest long-term benefits and cost savings. In the context of the opioid epidemic, primary prevention focuses on reducing initial exposure to opioids. This may include initiatives such as provider education, safer prescribing practices, and the use of non-opioid and non-pharmacological therapies for pain management.

Description of approach:

We propose to enhance the Albany Medical Center Emergency Department's Alternatives to Opioids and Pain Management Coach programs by integrating a virtual reality (VR)-based adjunct for pain management in patients experiencing acute pain. VR-based therapy is now a well-established non-pharmacological therapy (NPT) for treating painful conditions, with specific evidence supporting its use in the ED setting.(3-6)

Leveraging activities from the SAMHSA grant, our team has previously developed an NPT platform that includes a tablet-based delivery of music therapy and mindfulness applications. Current NPT options at Albany Medical Center include music therapy, the UCLA mindfulness app, art therapy, transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulation, and canine-assisted interventions. (Since September 2024, we have implemented these interventions in over 1,000 ED patients, with preliminary data indicating a 10.7% relative reduction in reported pain levels.)

However, we would like to expand our NPT options by Incorporating immersive VR technology as an additional NPT modality to further reduce opioid exposure and improve pain outcomes in this high-risk population.

Performance Measures:

- Patient Participation Rate
 - Measure: Eligible patients who agree to and complete at least one VR pain management session, with a goal of 100 participants in a one-year period.
- Reduction in Reported Pain and Anxiety Scores
 - o Measure: Average percentage reduction in patient-reported pain and anxiety scores (e.g., via Numeric Rating Scale) immediately before and after VR sessions.
- Patient Satisfaction with VR Experience

Measure: Percentage of patients reporting satisfaction with the VR experience (e.g., rating ≥4 out of 5 on a post-session survey).

NYS DISABILITY AND PAID FAMILY LEAVE BENEFITS LAW

§220. Subd. 8

- (a) The head of a state or municipal department, board, commission or office authorized or required by law to issue any permit for or in connection with any work involving the employment of employees in employment as defined in this article, and not withstanding any general or special statute requiring or authorizing the issue of such permits, shall not issue such permit unless proof duly subscribed by an insurance carrier is produced in a form satisfactory to the chair, that the payment of disability benefits and after January first, two thousand and twenty-one, the payment of family leave benefits for all employees has been secured as provided by this article. Nothing herein, however, shall be construed as creating any liability on the part of such state or municipal department, board, commission or office to pay any disability benefits to any such employee if so employed.
- (b) The head of a state or municipal department, board, commission or office authorized or required by law to enter into any contract for or in connection with any work involving the employment of employees in employment as defined in this article and notwithstanding any general or special statute requiring or authorizing any such contract, shall not enter into any such contract unless proof duly subscribed by an insurance carrier is produced in a form satisfactory to the chair, that the payment of disability benefits and after January first, two thousand eighteen, the payment of family leave benefits for all employees has been secured as provided by this article.
