**Justification**: (state briefly why legislative action is requested)

Albany County Mental Health made a portion of the County's Opioid Settlement Funds available to community providers through an RFP process. Agencies and community organizations were permitted to propose initiatives focused on opioid use disorder prevention, treatment or recovery, as well as supportive services such as housing and transportation. CPESN NY's project was selected for funding through an informed review process and will be implemented over the next two years.

The participating pharmacies will identify patients at risk of opioid dependence by adding screening questions about opioid prescriptions, enhancing signage within the pharmacies and on prescription bags and distributing

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Naloxone kits to patients. The pharmacies will also work with NY MATTERS to offer uninsured patients vouchers for a no-cost 14-day supply of buprenorphine/naloxone. We believe that the combined efforts of the CPESN member pharmacies will reduce the risk of opioid dependence and overdose in populations that can be overlooked.
