Date of Adoption:

Numerous Albany County Departments - including the Department of Mental Health, Probation, Public Defender, Alternate Public Defender, and Department of Social Services - have supported and participated with other stakeholders (including the City of Albany, Albany Police Department, Sheriff, District Attorney, Center for Law & Justice, Central Ave BID, and others) in the Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) initiative since its inception in 2015. LEAD is founded upon the principles of harm reduction when dealing with substance abuse, mental illness, poverty, and homelessness, and the intersection of these realities and the criminal justice system. The focus is not punishment, but rather treatment and support services. Frequently, clients who receive County services, including from the Department of Mental Health, Probation, Public Defender, Alternate Public Defender, and Department of Social Services, have contact with the LEAD Initiative. At the request of the Policy Coordinating Group for LEAD, the State University of New York at Albany has offered to evaluate the efficacy and outcomes of LEAD. To aid this evaluation, SUNY Albany has requested to enter into a data sharing agreement with numerous County Executive-led Departments, specifically the Department of Mental Health and Probation Department. However, the County Executive is also requesting approval for other County Executive-led Departments to opt into this data sharing agreement, should they also have pertinent data to contribute. The County Executive, Probation and Mental Health Departments are hopeful the data review will produce better LEAD outcomes and seeks legislative approval to proceed.

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
