 - In 2026, the Department will begin developing a County comprehensive plan to guide future growth, economic development, and investment in a coordinated and strategic way. The plan will be created with public input and establish a shared vision and outline

strategies for land use, housing, transportation, economic development, and natural resource planning. It will help County officials make informed decisions, coordinate with local municipalities and align with regional and state priorities.

- The County applied for funding through the 2025 New York State REDC Smart Growth Community Planning Program. Awards are expected to be announced in late 2025 and awarded funds will help offset the cost of the comprehensive plan.
- New York State General Municipal Law requires that local communities refer certain development applications and proposed zoning changes to the County Planning Board for review, comment and recommendations before taking final action. In 2026, the Department will implement a new online portal to streamline the GML submission and review process.
- Additionally, the Department will provide an increasing level of essential technical assistance on planning and zoning actions to municipal officials and County departments. The Department will also begin developing resource guides to facilitate the exchange of knowledge and best practices that support sustainable development and environmental protection, making research and implementation easier and more cost-effective.

 - Resolution No. 46 of 2025 amended the 2025 Albany County budget to increase funding to hire a temporary, part-time Commemoration Coordinator to provide operational support for the commemoration of the 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution in Albany County. The appropriation increased A8020-12624 by \$20,000.
- 14. Please describe the biggest risk your department faces and the actions you have taken (or will take in 2026) to better understand that risk and mitigate it.
 - At this time, there are no major risks we are building up the County's planning function to support the County's long-term goals and ensure that land-use, housing, transportation, infrastructure, and environmental priorities are coordinated and

sustainable. The addition of new staff members will allow the County to pro-actively focus on these areas.

- Q2 45 cases reviewed and 39 were voted on by the ACPB
- Q3 39 cases reviewed and 26 were voted on by the ACPB.
- TOTAL 148 cases reviewed and 126 voted on my ACPB
