Project Proposal: extending water service, Yolles Contemplation Park, Philip Street

1. Executive Summary

Yolles Contemplation Garden, a city-owned pocket park in at Philip Street where Myrtle Avenue and Bleecker Place come together, was once a well-maintained perennial garden with picnic tables, a bench and planters. People relaxed there and the neighborhood had small gatherings. Neighbors would also help tend to the Garden, however it is very difficult to do so because the absence of water service has been a major barrier to its upkeep.

The Mansion Neighborhood, known for its strong community engagement, is eager to reclaim and revitalize this space. The City, on behalf of the Mansion Neighborhood, is requesting a \$17,000 grant to cover the cost of extending water a water line to the site. With water access, residents plan to plant low-maintenance native perennials and shrubs, transforming the park into a vibrant community space once again.
