### **<u>DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST:</u>** (state briefly why legislative action is requested)

The Albany County Department of Mental Health (ACDMH) seeks permission to accept an Office of Mental Health Jail Diversion Continuation award and amend the 2024 budget. The purpose of this award is to continue funding for programs that were initially established in 2022 via COVID Relief funds. Funds are awarded for the development of diversion programs aimed at reducing the arrest and incarceration of individuals with Serious Mental Illness (SMI). The funding for \$130,560 is to be expended from April-December of 2024
