Justification: (state briefly why legislative action is requested)

This RLA covers the ninth year of Albany's participation in the Gun Involved Violence Elimination partnership for the Office of the District Attorney. Gun violence has increased exponentially in our vulnerable communities in Albany County. The law enforcement community is challenged by the proliferation of illegal weapons and the enhanced portals of accessibility. Criminal justice reforms have significantly hampered law enforcement's ability to stem gun violence and preemptively deter those involved in gun violence culture. New York, in collaboration with federal partners, has invested significant resources into intelligence based investigation by amplifying the abilities of our preexisting Crime Analysis Centers. The Crime Gun Intelligence Center functions will assist both police and prosecutors in prioritizing our cases. Exponential increases in the volume of gun related crimes had limited the efficacy of our state's deterrence investments. In response, the Albany County District Attorney's Office has received a total of \$702,579 for this next year, which is an increase of \$30,146 from last year. Last year, with these additional resources, we have fully funded two new lines for more experienced prosecutors who are also be assigned to the GIVE and CGIC group. The Intelligence ADA, which was a pre-existing line, is fully funded as well, along with part of the salary of the supervising attorney.

Memorandum of Understanding

Between

Albany Police Department, Albany County District Attorney, Albany County Probation, New York State Police, Trinity Alliance of the Capital Region, United States Attorney, Albany County Sheriff

The Parties listed herein have agreed to work collaboratively to reduce firearm-related crimes, shootings, and homicides within the City of Albany N.Y. through participation in New York State's 2024/2025 GIVE Initiative. The GIVE Initiative has been designed to build upon the success of our collaborative partnerships between Federal, State, County, City, and Community resources. These partnerships have been developed and deployed through years of support and guidance from NYS DCJS under "OPERATION IMPACT". The parties will develop a plan to promote integrated, evidence-based strategies to reduce gun violence that include four core elements:

- People focusing on known offenders and people considered responsible for the most gun violence in a community;
- Places -- targeting "hot spots" in a community that have been shown to be the most vulnerable to gun violence;
- Alignment aligning and coordinating efforts with other violence intervention groups
 working in the community, such as "violence interrupters" and other street
 outreach work; and,
- Engagement bringing stakeholders and the community as a whole together to work toward reducing gun violence.

The partnership, in collaboration with the Capital Region Crime Analysis Center, will utilize the Problem Oriented Policing SARA Model to conduct a focused examination of the crime problem with the end result being a comprehensive strategy designed to reduce shootings and homicides. The comprehensive strategy will incorporate evidence based practices in: Hot Spot Policing; Focused Deterrence; Street Outreach and Procedural Justice.

Through collaboration and participation with the Capital Region Crime Analysis Center, the parties will continue to analyze criminal activity, patterns, and trends in order to successfully target firearm related crimes. Our focus will be directed at enhancing information sharing between agencies, coordinated planning and execution of firearm reduction strategies, and an improved prosecution of firearm related cases. All parties will maintain an active role in reducing firearm-related crimes, shootings, and homicides through continued multifaceted strategies including, but not limited to, collaboration, communication, and cooperation.

WHEREAS, The District Attorney has requested authorization to submit a grant application and enter into an agreement with the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services regarding the Gun Involved Violence Elimination grant in the amount of \$672,433 for the term commencing July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024, and

WHEREAS, The District Attorney has indicated that the funding will be used to combat gun-related crime in Albany County, including additional positions regarding gun violence prosecutions, and

WHEREAS, The District Attorney has indicated that a budget amendment is necessary in order to fund said positions, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the Albany County Legislature that the County Executive is authorized to submit a grant application and enter into an agreement with the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services regarding the Gun Involved Violence Elimination grant in the amount of \$672,433 for the term commencing July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024, and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the County Attorney is authorized to approve said application and agreement as to form and content, and, be it further
