Albany Therapeutic Riding Center, Inc. (ATRC) provides equine assisted therapies to qualifying individuals including youth, adults and senior citizens. Participants are assessed and work with ATRC's instructors to achieve their respective physical, cognitive, social, and emotional goals, as described in their individual plans. Therapies include adaptive horsemanship lessons at a level that is safe and most beneficial for each individual and may include mounted horseback riding, or unmounted lessons in grooming, horse care and groundwork.

Our instructors hold certifications through the Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International (PATH), the Council for Education and Certification in Therapeutic Horsemanship (CECTH), Equine Specialist in Mental Health and Learning (ESMHL) and are certified coaches for the NYS Special Olympics Equestrian Team.

Albany Therapeutic Riding Center, Inc (ATRC) was the first therapeutic riding center in the Capital District, has been in

operation since 1981 and was incorporated as a 501(c)(3) in 1985. As a PATH certified program, ATRC serves youth and adult individuals with physical, intellectual and emotional disabilities and/or impairments while also promoting the advancement of equine assisted services for life-long impact. In addition to therapy services, ATRC provides mentorship services to future instructors seeking their own PATH certification and partners with local medical programs as an approved organization through which medical students can earn volunteer hours. Most recently, ATRC became certified as a training facility for the NYS Special Olympics Equestrian team and our instructors are certified to coach the team.

ATRC serves any qualifying individual who can access our facilities, and over half of the current ridership are Albany County residents. Some of the populations we serve include but are not limited to: Autism Spectrum Disorder, Cerebral Palsy, Paraplegia, Traumatic Brain Injury, Multiple Sclerosis, Down Syndrome, Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD), Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Anxiety, PTSD, visual and hearing impairment, Spina Bifida, veterans, youth at risk, and other physical, social, and learning disabilities. Finally, we take great pride in enabling people who might not otherwise be able to access a social or recreational program to enjoy therapeutic horseback riding.

ATRC will leverage any awarded funding in continuation and expansion of our therapeutic riding program by supporting staff retention and recruitment, and grant seeking activities with the goal of opening additional spots to individuals currently on our waitlist or otherwise interested in our services.

Sustainable Operating Model: Describe how your organization adapted its operations to respond to (a) the immediate impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and (b) any long-term trends brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic.

In the immediate response to the COVID health emergency, ATRC closely followed safety guidelines as determined by the federal Center for Disease Control (CDC), the NYS Department of Health (NYSDOH) and PATH. Response measures included a complete closure for 3 months, followed by a staged and stepped reopening incorporating mask mandates for staff, volunteers and riders, enhanced cleaning protocols and quarantine/return to work guidelines for staff and volunteers directly impacted by COVID.

ATRC continues to monitor and implement ongoing CDC, NYSDOH and PATH COVID-related guidelines, has sought to increase virtual fundraising where possible and continues to prioritize outdoor settings for in-person fundraising and other events.

If an award is made, describe how the funds will help the organization to recover from the negative economic impacts associated with the COVID-19 pandemic and to sustain long-term operations in Albany County.

Awarded funds will support the recoupment of revenue lost due to COVID-19 mandatory closures and will be leveraged to expand ATRC's capacity to serve members of our community through staff retention and recruitment and grant seeking

activities.

ATRC tracks the receipt and usage of all funding including grants using Excel workbooks developed by the organization's treasurer. ATRC's treasurer maintains records on all of the organization's financials and produces monthly reports for presentation to the Board of Advisors.

Please explain how the negative impact associated with the COVID-19 pandemic led to revenue loss:

As a PATH certified therapeutic riding center, ATRC serves a population with an increased risk of both contracting communicable illnesses and experiencing more severe disease outcomes. As such, ATRC followed all safety guidelines as determined by the Center for Disease Control, the New York State Department of Health and PATH to keep our rider population safe, including reducing or canceling services as called for. These safety measures resulted in zero fee-related revenue collected for the months of March - May 2020, a significant decrease in fee-related revenue collected over the duration of the declared emergency and the cancellation of key in-person fundraising activities.

During the COVID health emergency, ATRC was faced with the significant challenges of keeping staff on board and caring for the herd and maintaining their health so that they could adequately serve our ridership. These costs are incurred regardless of the number of lessons held. Although it is difficult to estimate exactly the amount of fundraising revenue lost for the year, we have provided an estimate to the best of our ability by comparing to funds raised in adjacent years. As a publicly funded non-profit organization, ATRC relies heavily on in-person fundraising activities to support our program, staff and the therapeutic horses that make the program possible. Many of these activities were restricted during the COVID health emergency, resulting in a significant decrease in vital funding for ATRC.
