Click or tap here to enter text. The Reentry program has been managed by the ACDMH (Albany County Department of Mental Health) since 2010. The Reentry task force provides rehabilitation and case management services to eligible individuals being released from state prison and seeks to reduce recidivism and promote quality of life to participants. The primary goal of the Reentry program is to reduce offender recidivism. It is expected that the Reentry program participants will be more successful in reintegrating into the community having received effective service planning and coordination. The Reentry program provides job readiness programs and sustained support during critical period of re-entry for program participants. The Reentry program remains committed to providing information, support and concrete assistance to the returning citizen of Albany County and working with DOCCS (Department of Corrections and Community Supervision) and parole officers to successfully maintain individuals in the community while reducing recidivism rates for the population

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that the program serves.
