RE: Highway Pavement Recycling
SUBJECT: SEQR compliance for highway pavement recycling 2023

I have reviewed the documentation provided by Commissioner Ramundo for the referenced project as it relates to State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR). According to that information, DPW is proposing milling of the existing 1 ½-2 inch top course of asphalt and placement of 1 ½-2 inches of new asphalt on a total of 24.75 miles of county road, as follows:

(CIP)* CR 252 from NY 156 to the County Line – 5.6 miles

(CIP) CR 411 from NY 32 to the County Line – 4.6 miles

(M/F)** CR 312 from NY 443 to NY 143 – 5.7 miles

(M/F) CR 409 from CR 405 to County Line – 2.1 miles

(M/F) CR 203 from NY 155 to NY 20 – 4.0 miles

(M/F) CR 152 from CR 154 to NY 155 – 2.75 miles

Total Mileage = 24.75 miles

Potential Additional Roads:

(M/F) CR 52 from NY 32 to NY 32 – 0.75 miles

(M/F) George Street from Tibbits Ave to Mason Ave -0.75 miles

*Cold in Place Recycling (CIP)

**Mill and Fill (M/F)

All work will be restricted to the immediate roadway right-of-way without widening or addition of travel lanes.

As described above, this project meets the criteria established for SEQRA Type II actions pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(5). Accordingly, this action has been determined not to have a significant impact on the environment, and as such, no procedural compliance beyond this determination is required at this time.
