<u>Justification</u>: (state briefly why legislative action is requested)

Albany County Mental Health made a portion of the County's Opioid Settlement Funds available to community providers through an RFP process. Agencies and community organizations were permitted to propose initiatives focused on opioid use disorder prevention, treatment or recovery, as well as supportive services such as housing and transportation. Colonie EMS' project was selected for funding through an informed review process and will be implemented over the next three years.

EMS workers are on the front line of the war against opioids, but, as with other first responders, there has been significant staff turnover in recent years. Colonie EMS will use these funds to maintain trained EMS workers on staff and to support at least one EMS worker in receiving training to become a paramedic. Training will be provided to all EMS workers and paramedics on co-occurring mental health and substance use

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disorders to reduce stigma and unconscious bias.
