Village of Voorheesville Albany County

Project Summary

The Village of Voorheesville is requesting funding from Albany County Parks and Recreation for the *Environmental Awareness Recreation Project* that will involve adding a fishing line and hook disposal tube to *Pine Street's Park*. The Project will also involve creating a new pedestrian trail in *Nichols Park* along Vly Creek to endorse creek access for recreation and raise conservation awareness to the valued natural resources in the Capital District.

Our Village is small, consisting of roughly 3,000 residents, but we continue to build regional connections and develop recreational value to the region. Pine Street Park is parallel to the 9-mile Albany County Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail ("Rail Trail") and consists of an open grass parcel (5,460 SF) and direct access to Vly Creek, commonly used for fishing. The Village was awarded funding to add an ADA compliant switchback paved walkway that will connect the Rail Trail down to Pine Street Park for opportune access to Village amenities and the Park for recreation (refer to **Appendix 2 Maps** for identified businesses and locations). As we embrace this new enhancement at Pine Street Park, our goal is to supply residents and all visitors with an ecofriendly tool to properly dispose of unused fishing equipment, like hooks and broken fishing lines, and create better access to the creek in different park locations. The Project will help preserve the water source, protect animals and park users, and encourage more recreational use at both park locations.

County Connections

The Rail Trail was introduced to the Village in 2018 when it made its lasting impact to the community through fundamental resources and network connections to Albany and neighboring areas, including disadvantaged communities. With the awarded project to install a switchback trail from the Albany County Rail Trail to Pine Street Park as well as the proposed project of creating better access to the Creek in Nichols Park, we foresee an increase in fishing recreation at both project park sites. Nichols Park presently has a narrow walking path bringing visitors from one end of the Village to the other, but there is often congestion between bicyclists and those walking. The new pedestrian path for Nichols Park will be about 200 ft. long, trailing off of the existing path at the entrance by Maple Avenue for a safer, more nature-based trail in the Park. The new trail will also compliment recent natural-resource conservation projects, such as the Rain Garden and Vly Creek bank stabilization efforts that were funded through Albany County Soil and Water Conservation.

Statement of Need

According to the Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP), Albany County's **Relative Index of Needs** ranks a demand for fishing recreation at a 7 out of 10, 10 demonstrating the most need in the County. A new walking path in Nichols Park along Vly Creek and a fishing line and hook disposal at Pine Street Park will allow residents and visitors of all ages convenient access to partake in fishing recreation and simultaneously raise natural resource conservation awareness.

Community Support

Nichols Park is conveniently located behind Village Hall where recreational activities such as youth summer programs, fitness classes, and sleigh riding in the winter occur. Many appreciate the Park for its convenient, centralized location and ease of access thanks to our newly adopted Complete Streets policy and the Albany County Rail Trail located just a quarter of a mile from the Park.

Our community is supportive of local projects that protect the environment and intended to improve the quality of life for our locals and visitors. We are fortunate to have residents, organizations, and an involved school district who engage in a variety of volunteer activities and recreational programs for all to enjoy.

During a Village Service Group meeting that consisted of several community organizations, all agreed that VIy Creek would be a valuable resource for future community and activity planning opportunities, including educational and recreational programs centered around nature and the environment. There has also been a big push from the community for more outdoor recreation since the pandemic occurred that will concurrently meet the needs of our growing community. The proposed project will reintroduce recreational basics like fishing or appreciating the outdoors before electronics consumed society.

Existing Conditions

Appendix 3 Reveals existing conditions, enhancements, and proposed park improvement plans for both **Pine Street Park** and **Nichols Park**.

Renderings

Appendix 5 includes renderings of the Project with *Before and After* images to demonstrate the proposed recreational enhancements to Nichols Park and Pine Street Park in Voorheesville.

Project Estimated Cost

The Village estimates a total cost of \$16,000 to purchase fishing disposal equipment, park amenities like benches and footpath lighting, and stone material to create a new walking path (200 ft.) at Nichols Park.

We are requesting \$10,600 from Albany County Parks and Recreation for the stone material, benches, foot lighting, and rental cost of the machinery equipment that will be used by our DPW staff to prepare the site.

The Village is committed to contributing up to \$5,400 through in-kind services when the Village's DPW staff perform site preparation which will consist of removing the existing horseshoe games in Nichols Park, followed by grading and gravel placement for the new walkway.

If the project exceeds the estimated amount of \$16,000, the Village will consider limiting or removing nonessential accessory features of the Project until park reserves are reestablished in the budget.


