DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST: (state briefly why legislative action is requested)

The Department of Management & Budget requests to reallocate unspent balances on American Rescue Plan Act funded grant awards. The Capital Region Workforce Development Board, The Center for Disability Services, and the Department of Management and Budget have each agreed to reallocate a portion of their ARPA awards because their projects are complete or because they don't have the administrative capacity to spend their award in full before the grant's deadline. The reallocated funds will be distributed to the Capital Behavioral Health Network so that they can continue their ARPA-funded workforce development project through the end of the Fall 2026 semester. This change comes at no cost to the County.
