**Description:** The stakeholders listed above are solicited to determine their needs. Meetings are then held with involved parties to discuss allocation of funding and opportunities for collaboration. These meetings include representatives from the Counties of Albany, Schenectady, and Rennselaer, as well as the Cities of Albany, Schenectady and Troy. The Albany County Sheriff's Office holds weekly/monthly/quarterly meetings with its partners in order to maintain an up to date assessment of the status and needs within Albany County, surrounding communities and their perspective partners.

The City of Albany is an active member of the Capitol region UAWG and as part, the members of the UAWG have met to form a consensual agreement on the allocation and expenditures of the SHSP/LETPP FY2020 award. The Albany-Schenectady-Troy urban area will continue to take a collaborative approach between the counties and cities in the furtherance of New York States' priorities with regards to investments made under the SHSP/LETPP guidance.

### Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Activities (SLETPP Projects)

**A: Involvement of Local Law Enforcement (SLETPP projects only)**- For State Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (SLETPP) applications, sub-recipients should demonstrate how they coordinated with local law enforcement in the development of their FY2020 SLETPP projects (e.g. participation of town and city police departments with a county sheriff's office in establishing law enforcement projects).

Description: The Albany County Sheriff's Office holds weekly/monthly/quarterly meetings with its partners in order to maintain an up to date assessment on the status of the needs within and surrounding Albany County and its perspective partners. The law enforcement partners include the New York State Police, Albany PD, Colonie PD, Bethlehem PD, Guilderland PD, Cohoes PD, Green Island PD, Watervliet PD, Coeymans/Ravena PD, Altamont PD as well as other state and federal agencies.

The City of Albany will require one contract with DHSES for the administration of funds under SLETPP in the amount of \$254,300.00 Albany will apply these funds to enhance our existing fiber route between Albany and Schenectady. Upgrading and replacing the network switches will allow for critical data, video and intelligence to be shared throughout the UAWG via the Albany County Crime Analysis Center. The City of Albany will also seek to utilize a portion of funding to support Operational Overtime costs incurred by members of the Albany Police CAAT (Critical Asset Assessment Team) for increased security at soft targets and mass gathering event sites within the City. The City will also seek to better equip responding officers to an active shooter at a mass gathering by procuring ballistic shields, additional P25 Radios and an L-RAD 300X to address emerging threats.

## NYS SHSP/SLETPP Priorities and Preparedness Objectives

**A: Engagement with NYS SHSP/SLETPP Priorities and Preparedness Objectives** - NYS has identified a series of specific priorities for the FY2020 SHSP/SLETPP grants. All sub-recipients are highly encouraged to engage these priorities, where it is appropriate to do so, with their project investments. **Priority #1 - Advancement of Regional Partnerships:** DHSES continues to promote the advancement of multi-disciplinary, multi-jurisdictional regional partnerships across New York State. These partnerships allow capabilities to be developed in a coordinated and cost-effective way. Over the past 10-12 years, effective regional partnerships have been developed in a number of different areas, including regional Counter Terrorism Zones (CTZs), HazMat Partnerships, Interoperable Communications Consortiums, Tactical Team Partnerships (formalized via Inter-municipal Agreements), Bomb Squad Regional coordination efforts, etc. Under the FY2019 SHSP/SLETPP grants, support for these (and other) regional partnerships and programs are strongly encouraged.

Description: In March of 2008, the mayors of the Cities of Schenectady, Albany and Troy met together with their counterparts from the counties of Schenectady, Albany and Rensselaer. At that meeting, it was decided that the initial governing body of the Urban Area Working Group (UAWG) would consist of the CEO's of the six jurisdictions, or their designees. It was agreed that decisions would be made by consensus, which was defined essentially, as unanimity. This simple mechanism was not further refined, as the focus became the rapid development of the Investment Justification, the Strategy, and then the project budgets. Each of these milestones was reached with the ad hoc structure created in March of 2008. These achievements have been widely viewed as an unprecedented example of inter-municipal cooperation.

Although the Capital Region Urban Area is no longer classified by FEMA as a Tier II UASI as of 2011, the partners continue to work together in a regional approach to prevent, protect, mitigate, respond to and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events.

**Preparedness Objective #1:** Ensure the lead law enforcement agency in the County/City maintains active participation in Counter Terrorism Zone (CTZ) activities, including the Operation Safeguard Program. The County's/City's lead law enforcement agency must attend at least one (1) CTZ meeting per quarter, support Operation Safeguard related taskings, and participate in Red Team exercises as requested by DHSES.

**Priority #2 - Maturation of Citizen Preparedness Efforts:** The presence of an active, engaged citizenry is a critical component of the State's preparedness posture. While several jurisdictions in the State have developed innovative citizen preparedness programs, the CEPA Program (along with other capability assessments) has found that this remains one of the lowest rated capabilities across the State. Under Governor Cuomo's leadership, the State has worked to address this issue through the State's Citizen Preparedness Corps Program, however, there is still additional work that local jurisdictions can do, building on and in support of existing models in the State. SHSP funds can be used for a variety of Citizen Preparedness projects, including the development (or sustainment) of citizen preparedness campaigns, training/outreach efforts involving Citizen Corps Councils and Community Emergency Response Teams, and for citizen preparedness kits and supplies.

Description: Five subcommittees have been formed to plan and implement the UAWGs Investment Justifications. Members are selected for subject matter expertise while maintaining jurisdictional representation. Sub-committee chairs are appointed by the Co-chairs. The following sub-committees have been formed:

- Critical Infrastructure Protection
- Data Sharing/Interoperability
- CBRNE/ HAZMAT
- Med Surge/Public Health
- Training & Exercise

**Preparedness Objective #2:** Maintain a Citizen Preparedness Coordinator to collaborate Citizen Preparedness efforts with New York State.

**Priority #3 - Development of Effective Cyber Security Programs and Policies:** All levels of government, the private sector, and the general public have been impacted by the dramatic increase in cyber attacks over the past five years. The proper detection, interdiction, and remediation of cyber vulnerabilities is critical. Through the CEPA program, DHSES has found that counties tend to be very concerned about the threat of cyber attacks, however, their capabilities to prevent and address these attacks are often underdeveloped. As such, DHSES is emphasizing the importance of cyber security in the FY2019 SHSP and SLETPP grant programs. Grant funds can be used for cyber security planning, cyber security enhancement equipment (including encryption software, malware protection, intrusion/detection prevention systems, and vulnerability scanning), cyber security training (which may require pre-approval; please consult with your Program Representative at DHSES); and cyber security exercises.

Description: Through our joint applications and regional partnerships the Capital Region UAWG addresses the 6 NYS Priorities to prevent, protect, mitigate, respond to and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events. At the present time both Albany County and the City of Albany are recipients of the DHSES 2019 Cyber Security Grant to implement its security upgrades as outlined in the program narrative. Both will continue to develop a robust cyber security program, to ensure residents' information, public safety and tax revenues are secure against hackers.

**Preparedness Objective #3:** Maintain an Information Security Officer (ISO) to coordinate cyber security efforts with New York State.

**Priority #4 - Enhancement of Law Enforcement Information-Sharing Capabilities:** Since 9/11, the enhancement of law enforcement information-sharing capabilities has been a top priority in New York State. The importance of this mission remains unchanged this year, as jurisdictions are encouraged to sustain and enhance their information-sharing efforts with the New York State Intelligence Center (NYSIC) and their local CTZ. Within this area, support for major outreach programs is prioritized, including participation in the Field Intelligence Officer (FIO) Program, and the engagement of Fire/EMS personnel in information-sharing activities through the Intelligence Liaison Officer (ILO) Program.

Description: The Albany Crime Analysis Center, which originally opened in 2009 to serve Albany County agencies, now operates six days a week and provides real-time analysis and support to police and prosecutors in the four Capital Region counties. It has also assisted agencies neighboring counties south to Dutchess, west to Fulton, and north to Warren and Washington. The expanded facility is located at Albany Police Department's South Station and features a video wall measuring 4.5-feet high by 12-feet wide that displays multiple sources of data and information in real time, including the Albany Police computer aided dispatch log and public surveillance cameras. The Center also has improved crime mapping capabilities, allowing analysts to better track crime in specific geographic areas. The Albany Center has roughly tripled the area it serves since it opened and now has data sharing agreements with 33 police departments and sheriffs' offices, which is nearly all of the agencies in the four county service area. The Center has 19 staff, including crime analysts and field intelligence officers.

**Preparedness Objective #4A:** Maintain participation in the Field Intelligence Officer (FIO) Program (to ensure information sharing between the New York State Intelligence Center and local law enforcement within your jurisdiction).

**Preparedness Objective #4B:** Maintain participation in the Intelligence Liaison Officer (ILO) Program (to ensure information sharing between the NYSIC and local Fire and Emergency Medical Services agencies within your jurisdiction). All counties are required to conduct at least six (6) course deliveries during the three-year performance period of this grant.

**Priority #5 - Continued Coordination of Emergency Management Planning Efforts:** Proper Emergency Management planning provides the foundation for effective response, recovery, and mitigation activities. Jurisdictions are encouraged to utilize their grant awards to maintain and update critical plans including Comprehensive Emergency Management Plans (CEMPs), HazMat Response Plans, COOP/COG plans, and Fatality Management Plans. Planning gaps identified during your county's CEPA process can often be addressed by leveraging SHSP (or SLETPP) funding.

Description: Both the City of Albany and the County of Albany have documented Comprehensive Emergency Management Plans that are updated regularly and disseminated to their personnel. The City and County along with our regional partners actively participate in drills and exercises to test and evaluate our emergency response plans.

**Preparedness Objective #5A:** Develop and maintain a Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan or basic emergency plan in accordance with Article 2-B of Executive Law. The plan should be reviewed annually and submitted by December 31 each year to the DHSES Office of Emergency Management.



**Preparedness Objective #5B:** Participate in the Emergency Management Certification and Training (EMC & T) Program, to include the County Chief Elected Official (Tier 1) and the County Emergency Manager (Tier 2).

**Preparedness Objective #5C:** Maintain a County Hazardous Materials Response Plan that is updated every three years and submitted to the DHSES Office of Fire Prevention and Control.

**Priority #6 - Sustainment of Effective Programs and Existing Capabilities:** In the last decade, New York State has effectively leveraged homeland security grant program funds to build critical programs to enhance our prevention, protection, response, recovery, and mitigation capabilities. Under the FY2020 SHSP/SLETPP grants, the sustainment and advancement of effective programs is a top priority, in order to ensure that core capabilities are maintained statewide. Emphasis will be placed on building, maintaining, and assessing sustainable programs, rather than simply purchasing disparate pieces of equipment.

Description: Albany County, and by extension the City of Albany, has a robust public health emergency preparedness program that conducts annual trainings and exercises to advance capabilities to prepare for and respond to public health emergencies. Physical security will be continued as cameras, servers, storage, software and licensing are updated to enhance monitoring and recording of critical events that include threats to infrastructure, County employees and the public. Additionally this funding will sustain the capabilities of our Explosive Detection Canine Teams and Hazardous Materials response Teams. The portable x-ray machine previously purchased for the forensic hazardous materials team is no longer servicable and must be replaced. This piece of equipment will allow suspicious packages to be inspected on site rather than having to move the item to inspect the contents.

**Preparedness Objective #6A:** Participate in updates to the County Emergency Preparedness Assessment (CEPA) process every three years or as otherwise directed by DHSES.

Project 2. \$90k for PoE ethernet switches and related equipment. – necessary to restore the fiber connection which carries data to and from multiple agencies, as well permits functionality of our citywide fixed camera surveillance systems along one the City’s primary arterials. These cameras are centrally coordinated and generate information which is broadcast to multiple local, state, and federal agencies via the CRCAC.

Description: Albany County has identified multiple areas in its cyber security that can be improved or need sustainment. The County's firewall (Palo Alto), which is currently funded through a DHSES Cyber Security Grant, requires a renewed subscription to ensure the county is separated from outsidess jurisdictions and municipalities in case of a cyber attack. Varionis Edge and Classification provide cyber security software and network protection from outside activity while additionally monitoring for internal and external attacks. Finally, KnowBe4 software provides training for all Albany County employees to reduce the human error that so commonly results in successful cyber attacks.

Sharable =	<b>Is the core capability supported by this project shareable (if it cannot be physically deployed) with other jurisdictions?</b> DHS identifies a shareable asset as any non-deployable capability that can be utilized to augment and sustain reinforced response at the regional, state or national level. Examples would include a fusion center, emergency operations center, etc.
