General Project Information

Describe the arts/cultural/tourism activities your organization provides in Albany County.

Now in its 25th year, the Albany International Airport's Art & Culture Program showcases the breadth and quality of the arts throughout the Capital Region as well as a resource for learning about local culture. Through changing exhibitions presented in the Albany International Airport Gallery and Concourse A Gallery, the Exhibition Case Program, its reading lounge partnership with New York State Writers Institute, and terminal-wide, large-scale temporary sculpture installations, the Art & Culture Program has extended the reach of area artists, museums and cultural institutions to an audience of more than three million people each year. In addition, the Program welcomes groups of students and seniors for guided tours of the Airport's art sites, customizing the tours for each population's interest and area of study.

If an award is made, describe how Albany County will benefit. Where possible, please quantify impact.

The Albany International Airport serves as the gateway to Albany County and the Capital Region. Through its Art & Culture Program, the Airport signals to visitors and residents alike that this area is distinguished by a robust and dynamic cultural climate, and that the creative economy is a valued and integral part of the Region's identity. The award that I'm seeking is for a project that will be highly visible to all who enter the Airport, and will be a feature of the planned terminal expansion. The Airport serves about 3 million travelers each year, and employs about 2000 people. The Airport also hosts special public and private events, and supports special visiting groups and individuals, from tour groups to sports teams to military service members and their families. The revenue our guests and employees spend at the Airport sustains and builds upon the quality of service we provide as a central asset and economic driver within the County. In addition to its substantial local workforce, ALB is a destination airport, where people come to live, vacation and do business. The Airport's Art & Culture Program presents exhibits that not only elevate the experience of travelers, but encourage tourism within the County by spotlighting local museums and performing arts venues.

If an award is made, describe how the funds will help you to sustain your operations in Albany County.

This award will allow the Albany Airport's Art & Culture Program to expand an existing, successful initiative into a new architectural space that welcomes all who enter the terminal. This project sustains and builds upon the Art & Culture Program's mission to showcase regional creative assets through temporary exhibitions, whose cyclical nature advances adaptability and visibility for participating organizations and individuals.

Passenger traffic decreased dramatically due to the COVID19 pandemic. The Albany International Airport had record setting 1,518,969 enplanements in 2019. With the start of the pandemic in March, 2020, annual enplanements for 2020 and 2021 were 520,029 and 976,037, respectively.

A Sense of Place Exhibition Case Program

The proposed project consists of a series of six enclosed exhibition cases that would be placed within the newly expanded entrance to Albany International Airport. The cost of fabrication and delivery is estimated to be \$81,851.00. The cases would house temporary exhibitions of art and artifacts loaned by individuals and institutions from throughout the Capital Region. These exhibits are intended to delight and inform visitors about specific artists and organizations, but also to pique curiosity, to impart a sense of place, and to change periodically for the benefit of viewers and participants. One of the best features of this project is that it is meant to present new objects, ideas, relationships and stories so that our Region, and our County are described in living, dimensional detail.

Please describe the entity's capabilities to implement the project you propose including organizational structure, staff members involved, a summary of similar initiatives you have undertaken and the date they were completed:

In 1998, the Albany International Airport developed a satellite Exhibition Case Program intended to feature regional museums and cultural organizations that would rotate periodically. Since then, more than 70 of these exhibitions have been presented - 16 from Albany County-based organizations - each one customized to reflect the participating organization's mission, collections and programs. This series consists of artifacts encased in museum-quality vitrines, with professionally designed graphic text panels accompanying the cases. The Airport's Art & Culture Program department, consisting of one full-time director and one part-time assistant, works closely with each participating organization to develop the panel narratives, select the objects for display, solicit accompanying interpretive material, design the layout and install the exhibitions. The Department oversees loan agreements, handles artifacts according to museum industry standards, and approves all elements of the exhibits prior to installation. The Sense of Place Exhibition Case Program would be similar in structure and function. The cases themselves would be designed to offer new passive climate-control features, and could be situated to allow viewing from all sides.

Please describe, in detail, the impact your proposed project will have on Arts, Culture and/or Tourism in Albany County. Describe how your project will attract new visitors to Albany County. Where possible use metrics/estimates of impact (i.e. increased visitation etc.).

This project would be installed in tandem with the Airport's expansion, and would be a highly visible feature of the new 11,000 sf second floor entry point to the terminal. By greeting travelers and their families with dynamic, changing and informative exhibitions at this threshold, we will build upon the Airport's commitment to elevating the experience of its guests and cultivating new audiences for local arts institutions. Air travel at Albany Airport has nearly returned to pre-pandemic levels, and is expected to hover at about 3 million visitors per year. The benefits of a robust public art program upon an airport's rating and bottom line have been well-documented and demonstrated.* But importantly, those benefits spread far beyond the boundaries of the airport into the wider community. In particular, airports like Albany International, with locally-focused arts programs, benefit from the goodwill those programs generate because of the increased visitorship to area museums, and honorariums issued directly to artists. Through this project, Albany International seeks to build upon an already successful model that has contributed to the growth of the Airport as well as the Capital Region for 25 years.

The completion of the new terminal expansion in 2025 will offer opportunities to visibly and vocally highlight the features of the expansion across print, broadcast and social media. In coordination with our communications team, these exhibitions will be touted as informative, attractive amenities whose changing nature will appeal to returning visitors, and assure a regular rotation of organizations and individual artists.

This initial media coverage will generate awareness of the exhibits and their contents, and we will track the extent of that coverage. With each rotation, interpretive signage will include web addresses and social media handles for the organizations and artists featured, as well as those specific to the Art & Culture Program. With those we will seek reporting on increases in web traffic and in-person visitorship, membership and sales where applicable. With each rotation, we will evaluate the impact of the presentations with the exhibiting participants.

Describe how the funding will support a sustainable Arts/Culture/Tourism initiative that will continue to serve Albany County residents after ARPA funds have been exhausted.

These cases will house a regularly rotating series of exhibitions that will promote local cultural organizations and artists at one of the most highly trafficked locations in the airport terminal. They will serve as an important extension of the already successful and now decades-long effort by Albany Airport to elevate the experience of its guests by showcasing the many cultural resources that our region has to offer.

Explain why ARPA Funds Are Needed to Complete the proposed program/project. Would the proposal be Possible Without ARPA Assistance? Describe how your proposal would be impacted if you are awarded a smaller grant than requested?

The airport's planned expansion is a highly anticipated and exciting event for Albany County, but associated funds

were not allocated specifically for art in the budget for this project. This award would allow the Art & Culture Program to infuse the new entry point to the terminal with an experience that would reward both visitors and the featured exhibit participants for many years to come. If the award was smaller than requested, the scope of the project would be reduced in the number of cases built, their overall size, or both.
