The New York State Department of Health has notified the Albany County Department of Health of a contract extension for the Lead Poisoning Prevention Program Grant (LPPP) for the period October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021 in the amount of \$142,442. The grant provides funding to perform environmental lead investigations when children are found to have elevated blood lead levels. Investigations will include initial inspections of the child's primary residence, any secondary residences where the child spends a minimum of 8 hours per week and any previous dwelling units where the child has resided within the previous three months to assess whether conditions exist that are conducive to lead poisoning. When lead hazards are found the department will meet with landlords, conduct follow up inspections and perform dust wipe sampling to ensure the hazards are remediated properly. Investigations of the child's primary

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residence will include all possible sources of lead poisoning such as toys, dishware, furniture, foreign manufactured cosmetics and medicines, jewelry, etc. Education will also be provided to the public of the dangers of lead poisoning and how to prevent it. The program seeks to reduce the prevalence of elevated blood lead levels in children through the implementation of a comprehensive program of primary and secondary prevention. This funding was anticipated in the Health department budget. ACDOH is requesting approval to extend the program from October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021.
